Dr Joanna Siekiera Originator

Dr Joanna Siekiera is an international lawyer, Doctor of Social Sciences in public policy sciences. She lectures at the Faculty of Law at the University of Bergen in Norway. She was a scholarship holder of the New Zealand Government at the Victoria University in Wellington.

She defended her doctoral thesis in 2017 at the Collegium of Socio-Economics of the Warsaw School of Economics. Her specialization is legal and political relations in the South Pacific, as well as international humanitarian law and regional security architecture. She completed internships in the Polish diplomatic missions, Institute of Cultural Diplomacy in Germany, School of Humanitarian Law in Russian, United Nations CIMIC Training School, and the French Institute of International and Strategic Affairs. She lectured at the University of Wrocław and the War Studies University in Warsaw, also serving as a LEGAD in international exercises.

She is the author of over 80 scientific publications in several languages and seminars i. a. in Canada, Georgia, France, Great Britain, Austria, Ukraine, Belgium and Estonia. From 1996 to 2010 he was an Associate Professor in the Department of History of Political and Legal Doctrines of the Faculty of Law and Administration of the Jagiellonian University. Since 2010 he has been a Professor at the Faculty of International and Political Studies of the Jagiellonian University.

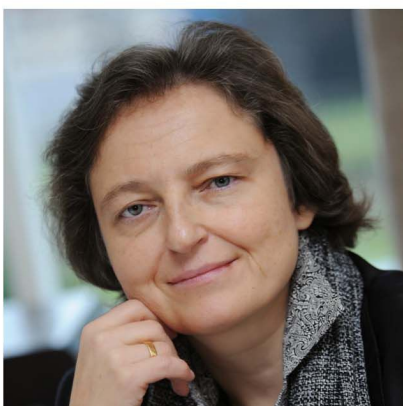
(PhD) Arkady Rzegocki

Arkady Rzegocki (PhD) is a political scientist, professor of the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, specialising in Polish and English political thought, the concept of national interest (raison d'État), as well as the issue of soft power. He studied at the Jagiellonian University and University College Dublin, conducted research in Denver (Colorado, USA), at universities in Oxford, Cambridge, London, and Florence, and was a Visiting Scholar at Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge in 2014.

Jason Rheinberg was appointed Deputy Head of Mission at the British Embassy Warsaw in July 2018.
